#### Kirklington with Sutton Howgrave Parish Council meeting

Present: Peter Hogan (chairman), Huw Dyer, Richard Wilson, Dave Ball, Cllr Webster, Ruth Walker (parish clerk), Ellen Craddock, Alan, Dorothy Hunt.

#### Matters arising from the last meeting:

1. The dog waste bins. Peter has liaised with Hambleton Council and 2 dog waste bins have been agreed. Peter confirmed the locations the bins would be erected at – one at the bottom of The Avenue, and one beside St Michael's Church. A further bin will be situated on Stapley Lane at a later date, this is being provided by Mrs Margaret Potter.
2. The new village signs. Peter updated with the situation. Dunhouse Quarry will only provide the stone, and will not be able to fit the stone into position. **Peter offered to speak to highways, area 2 (Thirsk) to seek advise.** Cllr webster suggested that a grant may be available. The Estate has offered to pay half of the cost of the signs. **Richard Wilson suggested Dales of Thirsk may give a quote, Peter offered to call them.**  
It was agreed that the village sign on St Michael's did not need updating at this time.
3. The street light on St Michael's View. Cllr Webster and Ruth had chased this. However it is the light outside Rose Cottage that needed to be on all night, not the one opposite St Michael's.

#### Agenda:

1. There is Defibrillator training on 26<sup>th</sup> November 2022, to be held in the village hall. Anyone can attend.
2. There is an issue with there being no current website, as BT had closed the previous account. **Peter has a company he can recommend, he will pass details to Ruth.**
3. Peter advised of his intention to hand in his notice as Parish Chairman. Huw offered to step into the role, when required, after being elected by Peter Hogan and Dave Ball.
4. The co-opting of parish council members was discussed. **Ruth to speak to the election team.**
5. The precept for 2023 was discussed and agreed to increase from £2300 to £2600. **Ruth to notify them by the end of November.**
6. Planning consent. The estate has applied for consent for change of use of agricultural land to domestic garden for use by 3 properties to the rear of St Michael's View. Dorothy expressed concerns regarding this. Kirklington with Sutton Howgrave parish council had not received notification of this (**Ruth to check why these were not received**). Cllr Webster reassured the council that it would not set a president for further developments. Any further developments would require a separate consent.

Meeting closed. Next meeting planned for 4<sup>th</sup> January 2023.
