Ruth provided a recent quote for the design of a website and purchasing a domain. £1280 plus VAT. Suggestions were to approach Nigel Jones son-in-law, and Richard Wilson was going to do some enquiries.C. Dog bins are now in situ. Current agreement was for quarry stone – these are £300 to £500 each and will be engraved. The current situation of the village signs will not allow sufficient space for the quarry stone. Peter was getting a confirmed cost. However there was concern regarding who would fit these and the cost of fitting. Ruth was also concerned regarding the cost, as at the moment the website took priority and it was looking like that would be expensive.</p> <p>E. Village street lighting outside number 16 church view. It was also noted that a street light was not working outside the village hall.</p>	<p>To confirm the cost of the website prior to continuing with plans for the signs.</p> <p>Cllr Webster will look into this. These will be getting cut back (by the power companies team).</p> <p>Questions were asked as to why the village had no Christmas tree this year. Would someone like to sponsor the Christmas tree.</p>	<p>Ruth to contact the Estate.</p> <p>Parish Council to look at how we could do this next year. Query getting electricity to it.</p>
